Fireworks reminders for a safe summer season

The Kootenai County Sheriff's Office wants to remind everyone that only fireworks classified as "non-aerial common fireworks" are legal to use throughout Kootenai County. Non-aerial common fireworks are those purchased in local temporary stands and some businesses throughout the many communities in the County.

Fireworks can be very traumatic for pets and many of our combat war veterans. So please be respectful of your neighbors. However, if you do decide to light off some fireworks this year, here are some safety tips the Sheriff's Office suggests you follow:

- Only responsible and sober adults should be lighting fireworks

- Kids should never play with fireworks. Things like firecrackers, rockets, and sparklers are too dangerous. If you give kids sparklers, make sure they keep them outside and away from the face, clothing and hair.
- Sparklers can reach 1,800°F; hot enough to melt gold.
- Buy only legal fireworks (legal fireworks have a label with the manufacturer's name and directions; illegal ones are unlabeled), and store them in a cool, dry place. Never try to make your own fireworks.
- Always use fireworks outside and have a bucket of water and a hose nearby in case of accidents.
- Steer clear of others; fireworks have been known to backfire or shoot off in the wrong direction. Never throw or point fireworks at someone, even in jest.



- Don't hold fireworks in your hand or have any part of your body over them while lighting. Wear some sort of eye protection and avoid carrying fireworks in your pocket; the friction could set them off.
- Point fireworks away from homes and keep away from brush and leaves and flammable substances. The National Fire Protection Association estimates local fire departments respond to more than 50,000 fires caused by fireworks each year.
- If a fire is caused by your release of fireworks, call 911 immediately.
- Light one firework at a time (not in glass or metal containers, and never relight a dud.
- Don't allow kids to pick up pieces of fireworks after an event. Some may still be ignited and can explode at any time.
- Please Pick up all fireworks trash from the lakeshore or water to prevent phosphorus from going into the lake which promotes weed growth.

From your Water District 95-C Watermaster Steve Neff

With a near-average amount of snowpack during the winter of 2022/2023, the lake level held to normally-expected levels last summer. Our recent winter was quite different, with snowpack levels reaching roughly 70% of average, at best. We are not expecting significant precipitation in May or June, meaning we could see lake levels fall significantly during August if we have another hot, dry summer.

We are continuing our efforts to get all water right/license holders in the water district to update their contact information with the Idaho Department of Water Resources (IDWR), as the watermaster does not have the ability to change personal information recorded in a water right/license. It is the responsibility of the right/license holder to update the information with IDWR. If your information is correct, you should receive a postcard from IDWR each spring with the details of our annual meeting. If there is a valid right/license on your property, you should see an annual fee assessed on your property taxes, regardless of whether your contact information is correct. Feel free to contact the watermaster by phone or email with any questions.

After receiving a large grant from the Kootenai County Aquifer Protection District in 2022, we went to work installing new measuring equipment at the spillway over the last year. This equipment provides better data on the amount of water Twin Lakes is contributing to the aquifer, more accuracy and transparency for low summer irrigation flows, and a more user-friendly interface for remote operation and monitoring of the dam by both the water and flood control districts.

Please conserve water where you can, and have a safe summer on the lake.

Twin Lakes Water Quality Advisory Committee (D. Jayne, 4-26-24)

Last fall the TLIA board decided to form a new committee to further improve water quality in Twin Lakes. The purpose of the committee is to evaluate, select and recommend to our association board projects that will provide the most benefits to improve water quality. Mike Knowles and Doug Jayne will co-chair the committee with Debbie Andrews and Dawn Dionne also serving as members. Additional members will be added over time.

spring and throughout the summer twice a month. TLIA will continue to monitor Department of Agriculture and report any spread of the mussels within Idaho.

To avoid the spread of Invasive Animals or Plants CLEAN, DRAIN, DRY ALL WATERCRAFT AND ITEMS THAT GO IN THE WATER – This situation is reminder to anyone who has watercraft or items you put in the water to be vigilant in practicing the steps of CLEAN, DRAIN, DRY before putting your watercraft or item back in the water. This includes boats, kayaks, paddle boards, canoes, oars, waders, boots, life jackets, fishing gear, buckets, nets, and other items.

Since none of us are water quality scientists, we reached out to environmental agencies, water quality scientists in academia and environmental consulting firms to assist us. We recently met with representatives from Idaho Department of Environmental Quality to explain our mission and ask for any assistance they can provide. They are amenable to providing guidance on helping us select which types of projects would be most useful and suggestions for making most effective grant applications to help fund projects. The goal is to file for a federal 319 grant application for a newly selected water quality project this summer. Grant applications are due July 15th, 2024.

Phase II Canal Dredging Project (D. Jayne, 4-26-24)

Following the successful dredging of the main channel in 2023, a second phase of dredging is proposed for this upcoming fall in the side canal extending along the north side of the channel between Upper and Lower Twin Lakes. This project is proposed by a neigh group of concerned citizens. The project will remove approximately 4,270 cubic yards of sediment from the canal over a length of 1,920 feet, an average width of 20 feet and depth of about three feet. The project should improve navigability by deepening the canal and improve water quality by removing phosphorus from the lake. The project has received all necessary permits. Envirodredge, the same contractor as used for the main channel, will do the dredging.



The sediment will be pumped up to 2,000 feet to the dewatering site at the Idaho Fish & Game channel boat launch parking lot. This is the same location as used for dewatering during the main channel dredging project. Large geotextile filter bags will capture the sediment during dewatering and the water draining back to the lake will be required to meet Idaho's water quality standards. The project is currently scheduled to begin this mid-September 2024. In the spring of 2025, the filter bag(s) will be opened, the sediment removed and hauled to the Scarcello Ranch about three miles away to be used as a soil amendment. The boat launch parking lot will be restored to its prior project condition as was done for the main channel dredging project. The committee is also investigating the possibility of recommending removal of a couple hundred cubic yards of additional sand from the channel narrows that couldn't be reached during the channel dredging project due to the unknown location of the North Kootenai water districts' buried water line. Removal of this sand may be possible if the district is able to locate the line.

Inland Empire Paper Company Woods Tour & Recreational Permit

Inland Empire Paper Company owns more than 120,000 acres of timberland in northeastern Washington and northern Idaho. Private timberlands like these provide many of the wood products used by the public. Gates open May 1st for all motorized access.

Let's Make Twin Lakes a Safe place to recreate- Know the safe boating rules

Safe Boating on the Twin Lakes is beneficial to all recreational users and property owners. If you have a rental property, please consider downloading the safe boating brochure and providing it to your rentals. This is especially helpful with short term rentals.

SPEED RESTRICTIONS

Speed limits for all public waterways except the Coeur d'Alene and Spokane Rivers, and Lower Twin Lakes are as follows: (read carefully, this information applies to the Upper Twin Lake and excludes the Lower Twin)

- NO EXCESSIVE WAKE ZONE, within (300') three hundred feet of shoreline or any dock, pier, breakwater, or any person in the water (except Fernan Lake).

- 5 MPH, a NO WAKE ZONE, within (200') two hundred feet of shoreline or any dock, pier, breakwater, or any person in the water.

- 50 MPH during daylight hours

- 15 MPH, or less, within (100') one hundred feet of any other vessel.

- 25 MPH, or less, at night unless otherwise restricted.

Speed limits for Coeur d'Alene River, the Spokane River, and Lower Twin Lakes are as follows: (read carefully, this information applies to the Lower Twin Lake)



- NO EXCESSIVE WAKE ZONE, within (150') one hundred fifty feet of shoreline or any dock, pier, breakwater, or any person in the water (includes Fernan Lake).

- 5 MPH, NO WAKE ZONE, within one hundred feet (100') of shoreline, dock, pier, breakwater, or person in the water, and

- 35 MPH, or less, during the day, unless regulated otherwise.

- 15 MPH within 50' of another vessel

- 25 MPH, or less, at night.

Don't Dump Your Dock

This year there was a record number of loose docks on the lake. Please read the following regarding the ordinance around derelict docks:



Kootenai County Parks and Waterways Ordinance 6.2.113: Derelict Docks and Float Houses:

A. No person shall allow a personal dock or float house to be released on any public body of water under which the county has boater safety responsibility.

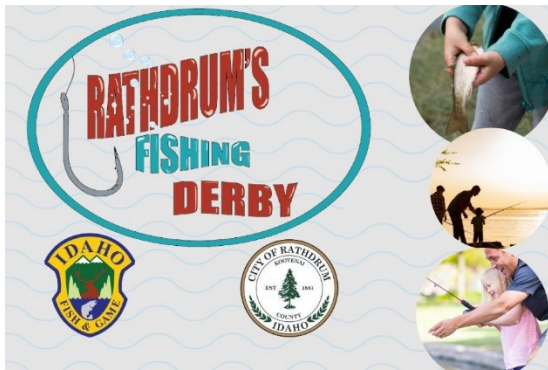
B. Owners of floating devices such as docks and float houses who fail to properly secure them will be subject to payment of recovery and abatement costs.

C. All docks and float houses shall be permanently marked and labeled with the owner's name, address and department of lands registration number on both ends of the dock. The marking or labeling shall be done in a permanent fashion in letters and numbers greater than two inches (2") in size. (Ord. 379, 8-30-2006; amd. Ord. 571, 10-19-2021)
